

Butterflies in the Garden

Who doesn't marvel at the sight of a Monarch or Swallowtail flitting about the garden? You can entice these intriguing insects to visit your garden regularly by providing plants that will meet their needs. Some plants provide nectar for the adult butterflies while others are food for the caterpillars. The plants eaten by caterpillars easily outgrow any "damage" that the chewing young cause. Not only cultivated plants need be considered. There are many weeds that are also beneficial food sources: Tarweeds, Dandelions, Cudweeds, Nettles, Plantain, Thistles, Mallows and Fennel to name a few.

Populus (Aspen, Poplar) **CA** and Salix (Willows) **CA** - Western Tiger Swallowtail, Mourning
